

# Drawing tickets selling for designer playhouse

Taylor Woodrow Homes' "Angels in the Clubhouse" playhouse is on public display at Fashion Island in Newport Beach. The playhouse, complete with Angels décor donated by the Angels Foundation, a plasma TV screen in the locker room, and stadium seating and floodlights on the roof, will be raffled off to one lucky Southern California baseball fan as part of HomeAid Orange County's Project Playhouse, the organization's signature fundraising event to raise money for transitional housing for the homeless.

The Angels Clubhouse is being presented by Taylor Woodrow Homes as the 2005 Project Playhouse Opportunity House, which will be raffled off at a public auction party on Oct. 22. Taylor Woodrow Homes put together an "extreme" team to build the playhouse, including architects JZMK Partners and "Extreme Makeover: Home Edition" designer Paul DiMeo, who was instrumental in conceptualizing the idea.

"In four years of participation in HomeAid's Project Playhouse, this is our most creative and exciting Playhouse design yet," said Mike Forsum, president of Taylor Woodrow's Western Region.

"We were thrilled to work

with Paul DiMeo who inspired the design and helped create the same magic that he does on his show each week. We are looking forward to helping HomeAid raise a significant amount of money through the raffle of this Playhouse."

Approximately 8 feet wide by 10 feet tall, the Angels Playhouse is one of 10 playhouses included in this year's Proj-

Orange County office for \$2 each.

Events leading up to the live auction include an open house today, which offers the only opportunity for the public to tour the insides of the playhouses. Playhouse Village tours will be held every weekend beginning Sunday; and the auction party and live public auction on Oct. 22.
